DOWNSTREAM ALUMINIUM

ALUTECH PLANT

The Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago has signaled its intention to proceed with completing the construction of the Alutech Plant at the Tamana Intech Park in Wallerfield.

This Alutech Plant will produce innovative industrial cast aluminium products including wheel rims and automotive parts. The Alutech plant will be supplied with aluminium ingots from external markets to produce finished high-end aluminium products.

ALUMINIUM INDUSTRY

Apart from the Alutech project the overall aluminium industry in Trinidad and Tobago is in an infant state based on an initial market sounding. There are few manufacturers of aluminium products who use imported ingots as their raw material to produce windows, doorframes and extrusions.

IDEAL FIRST MOVER ADVANTAGE

There is no supply of raw materials locally but there is the existence of a scrap metal industry which exports all scrap metal to the international market, mainly the United Arab Emirates (UAE), at varying prices. Also, there is no real concentration on recycling aluminium waste in the country which provides an ideal first mover advantage for investors to capitalize on.

OPPORTUNITY

A survey of scrap dealers indicated that the country's annual production of aluminium scrap is 6,240 tonnes, collected through twenty six (26) companies across the country.

Regionally aluminium can be sourced with current estimates of 35-50 tonnes monthly possible due to a ban on scrap exports by the Governments of Jamaica, Guyana and the Bahamas. These Governments may reconsider exports of scrap to niche markets.

Other regional supplies can come from South America, particularly those countries closest to Trinidad & Tobago – Colombia and Venezuela.

Investment opportunities exist in:

- **Sourcing aluminium scrap** locally and regionally to produce aluminium ingots and billets in Trinidad and Tobago for local, regional and international sale.
- **Castings and manufacturing** utilising ingots and billets manufactured locally.
